

Thoughts from the Phoenix Film Programming team

In the cinema world, the period between October and March is known as the 'awards corridor', in which all the films are released in order to be considered for major awards such as the BIFAs, BAFTAs, Golden Globes and Academy Awards. Unsurprisingly, it marks a busy time at independent cinemas! The films in this selection were all screened at the BFI London Film Festival back in October and some also featured in the programme for ICO's Screening Days, held here in November.

The common thread in award-winning films, to us at least, is the lasting effect on those who watch them, but the magic of each film comes from its unique combination of talent across the filmmaking team. Sometimes it's the performances central to the

storyline, such as Cailee Spaeny with her captivating and sensitive portrayal of Priscilla Presley in Sofia Coppola's **Priscilla**, the venerable Anthony Hopkins playing British humanitarian Nicholas Winton in **One Life**, or Paul Giamatti as a cantankerous school teacher in quintessential winter warmer **The Holdovers**. Other times it's the unique landscape and forensic construction of the world created which holds the key, Yorgos Lanthimos' **Poor Things** transports us to a steampunk reimagining of Victorian London as the fantastical setting for his Frankenstein-esque tale, or the chilling recreation of

Rudolf Höss' family home on the edge of Auschwitz in Jonathan Glazer's unsettling **The Zone of Interest**. In the case of **All of Us Strangers**, it's a heady blend of both performance and place that makes the indelible mark on audiences, the quartet of Andrew Scott, Paul Mescal, Jamie Bell and Claire Foy in Andrew Haigh's meditation on grief and loneliness in modern day London rendered our entire Film and Marketing teams speechless (and perhaps a little teary!) for some time after viewing.

At time of writing the BAFTA and Oscar nominations are yet to be announced, however speculation is already rife around the building about which films are most worthy of honours, so here are the official Phoenix picks for who we think should win this year!

## PROGRAMMER'S VIEW

Happy New Year! January 20th marks one year since we opened our extension and began operating as a four screen cinema. This has been a challenging yet exciting learning curve for the film team – finding the right balance of programme, making sure we have enough space to keep showing films that there is a demand for, and begging mercy from our wonderful projection team when we've been overzealous and programmed upwards of 15 films in one week, resulting in a very full server and rigorous testing schedule!

2023 was a tumultuous year in film. The cultural phenomenon of **Barbenheimer** meant a record-breaking summer, but in the midst of this the deadlock over the SAG-AFTRA strikes hit the industry hard, with actors unable to promote movies so films were being pulled or delayed from release, seemingly every week! Fortunately it feels like the industry is back, with a glittering awards season coming this winter full of beautiful films showcasing the full spectrum of human experience. Looking further ahead we're now seeing dates for those delayed films and 2024 is looking to be an absolute treat for cinephiles!

In March we have Dennis Villeneuves hotly-anticipated **Dune: Part II** and Ethan Coen's road-trip-buddy-comedy **Drive-Away Dolls**, followed in April by Luca Guadagnino's tennis thriller **Challengers** starring Zendaya, Josh O'Connor and Mike Faist. Later in the year we look forward to **The Bikeriders** the new film from Jeff Nichols (**Midnight Special**), starring Jodie Comer (who you can catch this month in **The End We Start From**), Austin Butler and Tom Hardy, we're eagerly waiting for this one to have its release date announced!

Although changes in the release schedule are something for the Phoenix team to worry about, from a cinema programming point of view, it does give me hope that with every change it means the horizon gets brighter, and many smaller films will get the chance to shine. We pride ourselves on bringing the best of film to audiences in Leicester, from big Oscar winning productions, to beautifully crafted independent passion pieces, telling stories from all over the world, and we can't wait to do it all over again this year.

In 1968, two Leicester-based artists and educators – Stroud Cornock (Leicester School of Art) and Ernest Edmonds (Leicester Technical College) – saw the potential of interactive computer-based art and after a chance meeting began to work together. This was the start of a tradition of computer art in Leicester and Leicestershire that continues to the present day.

In partnership with the Computer Arts Society (CAS), this latest exhibition in our Café Bar explores Leicester's computer art history from the 1960s to the 1990s, and features historic and contemporary work by eight artists who lived and worked in the city and county during this era: Stroud Cornock, Ernest Edmonds, Stephen Scrivener, Dominic Boreham, Graham Bate, Brian Reffin Smith, Sean Clark and Stephen Bell.
